In the US there have been some reported incidents of parents having finger lacerations when folding the B-AGILE 3 pushchair. BRITAX USA has therefore decided to launch what they call in their market a 'voluntary recall action' on the B-AGILE 3 and BOB MOTION (US version of B-MOTION 4). Within this voluntary recall action, the product is not being taken back from consumers but a free remedy kit is being issued.

There have been no reports of incidents from any other market/region outside the US, but as a global and responsible company, BRITAX is taking wider action to ensure peace of mind for all parents in the Europe, Middle East and Africa (EMEA) regions too. The same solution is being offered in the EMEA regions as in the US, but based on localised terminologies, it is being called a 'Quality Initiative.' The safety advice/quality initiative applies to the following products B-AGILE 3, B-AGILE 4, B-AGILE Double, B-MOTION 4 (B-Motion 3 is NOT affected) and offers a free remedy kit which allows parents to modify their pushchair in case they feel unsafe.
